

Downtown Corridor Minutes SETRAC August 2, 2024 SETRAC Conference Center Houston, Texas 77008



A. Call to Order

Michael Olivier called the meeting to order at 1:00 pm.

B. Approval of Minutes (C101)

Michael Olivier requested review and approval of the April minutes. Denis Hyman (Memorial Hermann) made a motion to approve the minutes, Jenny Pfannes (Memorial Hermann System) seconded the motion, and the corridor members carried the motion. The minutes were approved as written.

C. New Business

• Pulsara Overview

There was in-depth discussion regarding the pros and cons of Pulsara during Hurricane Beryl focusing on EMS transportation and evacuation situations. Lisa Spivey advised that SETRAC is working with Pulsara to iron out the issues and updates will go out as they become available.

D. HPP Capabilities Review

• ASPR HPP Work Plan

Lisa Spivey reported we are in the new grant period and there are a few extra deliverables that need to be reported to ASPR. SETRAC will be conducting a cybersecurity exercise and will be reaching out for volunteers to join the exercise planning committee. Ms. Spivey explained SETRAC is required to report what the region is doing, how we are doing it, and how we are going to gauge completing the deliverables.

F. EMTF Update

Grant Kelley provided an EMTF update as follows:

EMTF 6 Deployed Severe Weather Package ACADIAN, CITY, CYFAIR, La Jackon EMS, LaPorte EMS, HCESD 8. The teams worked with HFD and Harris County to evaluate licensed and unlicensed health care facilities' needs. We also performed an o2 bottle exchange to assist with keeping citizens out of Emergency Rooms.

The EMTF had a response to Hurricane Beryl that consisted of 363 Personnel and 218 Assets Resources responded from all 8 of the EMTF Regions! Thank you to EMTF6 Agencies: Fort Bend County, Houston Fire Dept, Atascocita FD, Lumberton Fire Dept, Port Arthur Fire Dept, Laporte EMS, Acadian Ambulance, City Ambulance, AMR for providing Resources to assist their fellow Texans.

- 4 task force leaders
- 39 MIST
- 21 Ambulance Strike teams
- 8 Ambuses
- 10 Paramedic Coach Buses

EMTF tasked augment 911 responses in multiple jurisdictions with over 500 transports by EMTF

EMTF reduced wall time by sending MIST personnel to local hospitals to attend patients enabling ambulance teams to go in service and provide coverage for the area. EMTF participated in Oxygen Exchange in Houston/Harris County in an attempt to mitigate unnecessary transports to the already inundated emergency rooms. 163 addresses.
